Minutes of October 24, 2020 Mission Center Conference

Heart of Texas Mission Center Conference Minutes Saturday, October 24, 2020 @ 1:30 p.m. Via Zoom

Mission Center President Joe Postnikoff welcomed all to the Heart of Texas Mission Center conference and called the meeting to order at 1:30 pm. The conference opened with the congregation singing CCS 357 "Christ, You Call Us All to Service". David Watson offered the invocation.

Greetings from the World Church

The Chair then recognized Moana Faana who offered greetings on behalf of himself, World Leadership, President Veazey, Stassi Cramm, and Apostle David Nii.

Secretary

The Chair informed the conference that Candace Tillman agreed to serve as acting secretary for the conference.

Review of Conference Online Voting Procedures

The Chair recognized Chris Beck to provide insight into the voting procedures to be observed during the conference. Zoom polling system to be used with audible vote used to reconcile any discrepancies. Each voting result is shared with the conference as submitted.

Approval of Minutes

The Chair noted the minutes of the September 21, 2019 mission center conference were previously published on the mission center website and distributed through the mission center email chain. They are also printed on pages 19 through 22 of the Conference Bulletin. There being no offered changes or corrections, the minutes were declared approved as submitted.

Commonly Used Parliamentary Actions

The Chair informed the conference that there was, on page 2 of the conference packet, a list of commonly used parliamentary actions. The Chair also informed the conference that, if anyone was unsure as to how to participate, they should just make a parliamentary inquiry with the Chair.

Mission Center President's Report

The Chair informed the conference that the Mission Center has become more accustomed and adept to the use of technology and online services to facilitate all of its meetings and social activities. The Mission Center is committed to hosting online Communion Sunday services, priesthood classes, and pastors' forums, and assisting congregations in using Zoom for worship services. New activities are being planned for the upcoming year.

Mission Center Financial Officer's Report

The Chair called the attention of the conference to the Mission Center's YTD Operating Fund Income and Expense Statement located on pages 23 and 24 and the 2019 Audit Report located on pages 11 through 14 of the Conference Bulletin. The Chair recognized Chris Beck for a brief statement concerning 2019/2020 finances.

Chris Beck presented the Heart of Texas 2019/2020 financial statements and reviewed Balance Sheets, Receipts, Disbursements, Undesignated, Equipment and Operating Reserve Funds. Chris made special note that the expense for e-tithing and Zoom subscription are

considerably more than expected. This is a natural consequence of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Sionito Campgrounds Association Report

The Chair called attention to the Sionito reports found on pages 25 through 36 of the Conference Bulletin. The Chair then recognized Nick Sanders to make a report to the conference concerning the Sionito Campgrounds Association. Nick noted that, due to the pandemic, camp expenses have significantly changed. Renting the Villa on Air B&B, and an increase in private RV campsite rentals are helping continue to fund Sionito. The Chair added that there are 3 larger contributions anticipated to be made from Heart of Texas and Coastal Bend Mission Centers as well as an anonymous donation. Nick spoke about wanting to enable the camp groundskeeper to return from abroad to resume the job.

Sionito Camping Committee Report

The Chair called attention to the 2019 Camping Committee Audit Report found at page 15 through 17 and the Camping Committee Report for the 2020 camping season which is found on page 37 of the conference bulletin.

The Chair noted that there were no live camps but directors hosted online camps. Everything was donated by directors and staff with the exception of the cost of t-shirts. The Chair called attention to a much lower attendance due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Congregational Life Events Summary Report

The Chair called attention to the Congregational Life Events Summary on page 52 of the conference bulletin. The Chair then recognized Chris Beck to make a report to the conference.

Report on Registered Youth Worker Training

The Chair called attention to the Report on Registered Youth Worker Training found on page 38. The Chair then recognized David Watson to present the report on the Registered Youth Worker Training Initiative. David made special note that a new Mission Center online Zoom training class will be available to members and priesthood.

Other Reports and Recognitions

The Chair called attention to the 2020 and 2021 calendars found on pages 43 and 44, respectively, of the conference bulletin. The Chair recognized Katie Barber who added information and request for participation in the upcoming Advent Daily Devotional. The Chair then called attention to the publication of the Mission Center Leadership Team membership, Support Team membership, Boards and Committees memberships found on page 39 of the conference bulletin. The Chair then called attention to the contact information for the Mission Center's leadership team, program and support team, pastors, CFOs, and communications officers listed in the bulletin beginning on page 40.

The Chair announced the addition of Katie Barber to the Mission Center Leadership Team as the new Mission Center Invitation Support Minister.

The Chair then asked for recognition of the efforts of Shannon Everett and Kathleen Johnson - the outgoing and incoming pastors of the Carrier Parkway Congregation.
